General characteristics of the Constitution of Ukraine. The system of public authorities in Ukraine. Powers and Constitutional Status of Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine, President of Ukraine, Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine.

Topic 3. Fundamentals of Civil Law of Ukraine

General principles of civil law. Subjects and objects of civil relations. Legal status and capacity of individuals and legal entities.

Topic 4. Fundamentals of Labor Law of Ukraine

General characteristics of labor relations. Labor contract. Termination of labor relations. Legal regulation of labor disputes.

Topic 5. Fundamentals of Criminal and Criminal-Procedural Law of Ukraine

General characteristics of the Criminal Code of Ukraine. General characteristics of the new Criminal-Procedural Code of Ukraine. The concept and signs of a crime. Classification of crimes. Purpose and types of criminal punishment. Circumstances that mitigate and burden liability. Punishment and its purpose.

Topic 6. Fundamentals of Family Law of Ukraine

Rights and duties of spouses. Prenuptial agreement. Rights and responsibilities of mother, father and child.

Topic 7. Fundamentals of intellectual property

Objects and subjects of intellectual property rights. Legal basis of intellectual property. Acquisition and protection of intellectual property rights.

Topic 8. Law enforcement and judicial systems

The Constitutional Court of Ukraine. The system of courts of general jurisdiction. Commercial courts in Ukraine. System and tasks of law enforcement agencies of Ukraine.
